

Covid-19 Plan for School SY 23

Districtwide Procedures and Expectations	
Daily Schedule	 In-person instruction will be available for ALL students. The first day of school will be Thursday, August 18, 2022. All schools will begin instruction at 7:35 a.m. All schools will dismiss instruction at 2:40 p.m. The virtual instruction program will no longer be an option for students.
Face Masks	 Face masks will be ENCOURAGED for all students, staff, and visitors.
Social Distancing	Social distancing will be maximized when possible.
Screening	 Students and staff should stay home when sick. Do not send a student to school with a fever (100.4 or greater).
Sanitation and Environmental	 The district will provide cleaning spray and hand sanitizer for each room. Teachers will spray desks and other surfaces on a routine basis. Washing of hands will be encouraged. Custodians will clean common areas regularly. Air purifiers will be utilized in each classroom. Schools and busses will use ventilation strategies to the fullest extent possible.
Testing and Tracing	 Covid-19 testing will be available at each school. Contact tracing will be handled on a case-by-case basis in consultation with the health department.
Vaccinations	 Vaccination for Covid-19 is not required to attend school. Vaccines for Covid-19 will be available through the Healthy Kids Clinic for anyone who wishes to have their child 12 and above vaccinated.

The School Day for In-Person Instruction at All Schools	
Busses	 Children living in the same household are encouraged to sit together. Students will be asked to spread out and put as much space between them as possible while on the bus. Busses will be sanitized at the end of the morning and afternoon route after students have been unloaded.
Classroom	 Students must have assigned seats in every class; teachers will keep a record of the seats assigned' and students must sit in their assigned seats every day.
Restrooms	 Supervision at the restrooms will help ensure overcrowding does not occur and social distancing is adhered to as best as possible (restroom capacity will be limited to the number of toilets in the restroom). Students will wash their hands before leaving the restroom.
Water Fountains	 The water fountains and water bottle filling stations at each school will be open. Students are encouraged to bring their own reusable water bottles.
Visitors	 If possible, visitors are asked to make an appointment before visiting a school. Any parent or visitor who drops in during the school day will have to stay in the reception area.
Technology	 Each student will be assigned a Chromebook or electronic device and a Technology Contract will be signed by parents and students.
Field trips and Assemblies	 Smaller assemblies or necessary group meetings may occur according to school and district guidelines.

After-School Programs and Athletics	
After-school activities	 School-sponsored after-school activities will take place according to guidelines provided by the district and state. Students must stay with their faculty sponsor during the activity. Groups must stay in a specific assigned area and sponsors will stay with students until they are picked up. Athletics will follow guidelines published by the Kentucky High School Athletic Association (KHSAA).
